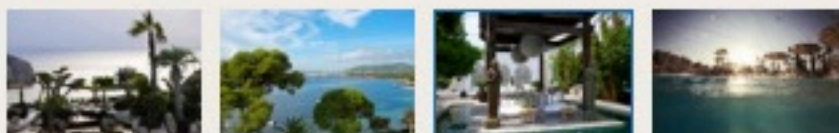
This has been partly solved by the news that one of the island's best agrotourism hotels, **Atzaró**, newly reopening this spring after a refurb, is now set to open year-round, putting up guests in its beautiful Indo-Ibizencan rooms, feeding them from its abundant gardens, and rubbing them all over in its delightful outdoor spa (the only one on the island, *pictured*). The overhaul includes a renovation of its beach restaurant in Cala Nova, in the north of the island.

Now, how to get there... **British Airways** has come to the rescue, launching year-round flights from London's oh-so-civilised City Airport to the White Isle. Another advantage of going out of season: none of the go-large brigade on the no-frills flight. In fact, no no-frills flights at all!
